A How-To Guide

Our United Villages coordinated the Boise Neighborhood Ice Cream Social for five years before handing it off to the Historic Mississippi Business Association to continue as a neighborhood tradition. This is an annual event that takes place on the hottest day of the year. We share this “how to” guide in the hopes that this event can be used as a community-building concept in neighborhoods everywhere. This document is like a tool chest, take from it whatever works best for achieving your own neighborhood or community goals.

Our Sharing Ideas events and Legacy Stories provide a platform for increasing awareness about how people are actively engaged in strengthening the social fabric of their community. Note: In 2002, Our United Villages launched Community Outreach to serve as a free resource for those who see value in each other. In 2013, Community Outreach evolved into the Community Legacy Program of Our United Villages. This tool packet refers to both Community Outreach and the Community Legacy Program.

HISTORY & PURPOSE

In 2003, Boise neighbors began to see rapid changes on N. Mississippi Avenue with the influx of new businesses. There were mixed feelings about the change. Some folks liked it while others felt left out.

Business owners expressed a desire to connect with the Boise community and to create stronger ties with neighborhood residents. An Ice Cream Social was suggested as an opportunity to build positive relationships between new businesses and surrounding neighbors. Community Outreach went to the Historic Mississippi Business Association (HMBA) to present the idea: businesses could come together to give away free ice cream to the neighborhood on one of the hottest days of the year. The businesses loved the idea.

The Boise Neighborhood Ice Cream Social has taken place every year since then. From 2004 until 2009, Our United Villages provided leadership and staff support for coordinating the event until it was established as a neighborhood activity. In 2009, the Historic Mississippi Business Association assumed responsibility for coordinating the Ice Cream Social. Inside the period of one hour, every year, Boise business neighbors dish out thousands of scoops of complimentary ice cream.

The Boise Neighborhood Ice Cream Social is self-sustained through Boise business participation; there are no outside sponsors or grants used for this event. The goal is to have every business participate, whether by scooping ice cream for one hour, hanging posters, delivering maps, or making a financial contribution. Some businesses choose to provide a cash donation instead of scooping ice cream to cover the cost of:

- Non-profits that want to participate
- Printing Ice Cream Maps and Posters
- Temporary Restaurant Application

The values that form the foundation for the Ice Cream Social are:

- For neighborhood businesses to give back to community and express thanks
- To sponsor an activity that fosters inclusive, respectful community
- To create a tradition that residents will look forward to every year
- To have social interaction between residential and business neighbors
- That it is free and open to everyone in the neighborhood

COORDINATION DETAILS

An ice cream map is delivered to every address within the neighborhood, showing participating businesses and the flavor of ice cream they will serve. Businesses set up ice cream stations on the sidewalk in front of their doors. Neighbors get their pick of 50+ flavors as they walk up and down the street. Individual businesses pay for their ice cream order and give it away for free to neighbors.

The Boise Neighborhood Ice Cream Social continues to grow each year. In 2008, 66 businesses participated and served more than 4,500 scoops of ice cream in an hour!

How is the Ice Cream Social sustained?

Each business pays for its own ice cream and supplies. In 2008, 62 businesses ordered ice cream. The total cost of the Ice Cream Social was \$2,250 and each business paid an average of \$36.00. Individual businesses donated funds to support participation of nonprofits in need of assistance.

How the money was spent:

Temporary Restaurant Application	\$50.00
Ice Cream Supplies	\$950.00
Ice Cream	\$1150.00
Printing	\$100.00

Who organizes the Ice Cream Social?

We have learned that it is helpful to have one coordinator keeping track of the ice cream orders and timelines. Form a committee or recruit volunteers to help get the word out, deliver ice cream maps, and clean up.

What are the health code requirements?

The coordinator completes a Temporary Restaurant Application and obtains a Food Handler's Card. Each station serving ice cream must have a hand-washing station consisting of a 5-gallon bucket with spigot, soap, and paper towels. Ice cream servers must wear gloves. TIMELINE

PRE-PLANNING (Several months in advance)

Select a day

- The Boise Neighborhood Ice Cream Social is on the hottest day of the year (usually the first week in August), on a Tuesday night from 6:00pm-7:00pm
- When selecting a date, research city wide and neighborhood events, communicate with businesses about their schedules and availability, and identify a time when businesses are still open and neighbors will be home

Contact Ice Cream Supplier

- We coordinated with Sunshine Dairy
- Request a list of their current flavors and pricing for 3 gallon and novelty ice cream flavors
- Create a master list of flavors that businesses will use to select a flavor (in order to not have duplicate flavors)

Contact Health Department

- Fill out Temporary Restaurant Application online at <http://www.co.multnomah.or.us/health/mchealthinspect/tempfood.html>
- Submit cash or check for \$50.00 to pay the Temporary Restaurant Application fee
- Due *no later than* 14 days before the event

Food Handler's Card

- Take test online
- Pay \$10 with credit card

Get Organized

- Create an Ice Cream Order Sheet for businesses to fill out
- Identify where to purchase ice cream supplies (bowls, spoons, cones, etc.)
We coordinated with Cash and Carry, New Seasons, and online orders for compostable bowls
- Identify all of the neighborhood businesses (use online resources such as the business association website and/or map out the businesses by walking around the neighborhood and taking notes)
- Make a list of all of the businesses including a contact person and email address

Get the Word Out

- Identify the languages spoken in the neighborhood
- Create a flyer
- Translate the flyer into the identified language
- Bring flyers to local schools, community centers, the Neighborhood Association, and the Business Association

- Give presentations about the Neighborhood Ice Cream Social at the neighborhood and business association meetings
- Draft and mail a letter of introduction/explanation and mail or hand-deliver to all the businesses in the neighborhood

Get Ice Cream Orders

- Select a date that Ice Cream Orders are due based on when the ice cream supplier can deliver.
- Email the Ice Cream Order Sheet to every identified business Do follow-up calls or visits to get ice cream orders from businesses

3 WEEKS BEFORE THE EVENT

Make a draft of the Ice Cream Map

- Start with a template of the streets
- Add the name of the businesses and their flavor
- Include a Thank You section for donations and volunteers

The Ice Cream Poster

- Include photos of the neighborhood or previous ice cream socials
- Make sure that the word FREE is prominent on the poster
- Print in an easily readable font on durable color paper, if possible.
- Hang Posters in strategic locations throughout the neighborhood

2 WEEKS BEFORE THE EVENT

Invoices

- Create and print invoices for each participating business to staple to their supply bag
- Email the invoice to the participating businesses
- Collect ice cream and supply costs as well as donations from participating businesses

Submit the Ice Cream Order

- Once you have confirmed the type and quantity of ice cream each business is ordering, place the order with your supplier

Note: Sunshine Diary requests ½ of the total amount due at the time you place the order

- Compostable bowls and spoons can be ordered online.

Complete the Ice Cream Map

- Include all participating businesses, whether they are scooping, or donating time/money
- Print enough to ensure that each participating business gets a stack of 20 and enough to cover distribution to each residential neighbor. Use volunteers to canvass or utilize the neighborhood newspaper.

I WEEK BEFORE THE EVENT

Submit Ice Cream Supply Order

- Total the number of supplies you need (e.g. cones, scoops, hand-washing buckets, gloves, paper towels, soap)
- Order these supplies to have on hand before the event. We coordinated with Cash and Carry (a local restaurant supply wholesaler); you can call the manager one week in advance, give them the item numbers, and they will put together your supplies for pick-up
- Leave maps on residents' porches, in screen doors, under doormats; it is illegal to *place* maps in US Post Office mailboxes.

Go to each participating business

- Create a "Free Ice Cream Served Here" sign for each participating business
- Create a FAQ or schedule for the day of the ice cream social
- Deliver the materials to businesses and answer any last minute questions about participating

I DAY BEFORE THE EVENT

- Pick up the ice cream supplies
- Staple an invoice to each brown bag with handles
- Divide up the cones, bowls, spoons, garbage bags, gloves, soap, and paper towels
- Label the hand-washing buckets
- For the businesses who are using compostable bowls & spoons, make sure they have a (1) compostable garbage bag; (2) cardboard box, and (3) a "compostable bowls and spoons only" sign
- Organize the packaged supplies in terms of pick-up or delivery

THE DAY OF THE EVENT

4 hours before event:

- Pick up the ice cream
- Sunshine Dairy loads the large ice cream freezers onto a trailer for you OR the ice cream can be delivered; however picking up the ice cream is cheaper than having it delivered
- Label each cooler with (1) the flavor AND (2) which businesses it belongs to

3 hours before event:

- Draw ice cream cones and arrows on the streets in chalk

2 hours before event:

- Deliver or have businesses pick up their ice cream/supplies
- We found that having businesses pick up their ice cream worked better; we reserved a 2-hour block where businesses picked up and paid for their orders.

1 hour before event:

- One of the most successful outreach methods that we have experienced is catching people on the day of the event as they are on their way home from work, getting their mail, or sitting on their porch. Most people will already know about the event (as they received the announcement in the

neighborhood newspaper and an ice cream map) and this serves as a last minute reminder that is it tonight and happening now!

- You can ride a bike, walk, or zip around on a scooter announcing the free ice cream

During the event:

- Be prepared to give the Health Department a tour of the event
- Stroll through the Social; provide additional supplies to anyone that needs them
- Respond to calls (e.g. move stations to the shade and/or deliver a chunk of dry ice from the cooler)
- Take photos of businesses serving ice cream to neighbors

Following the event:

- Help clean-up
- Sort the compost bins (any garbage or recycling items in the compost make it unusable)
- Take down the Ice Cream Posters

THE NEXT DAY

- Return or have the coolers picked up
- Collect the money from the organizations who haven't paid yet
- Send out a thank you email requesting feedback about the event
- Talk to neighbors about the event

4. Set out a table in front of your place of business around 5:30/5:45 with 1-2 staff/volunteers
5. Scoop ice cream for neighbors between 6:00-7:00 (or until the ice cream runs out!)

The coordination of this community effort is supported by a committee that takes care of:

- Ordering and picking up the ice cream and supplies
- Delivering the ice cream to the businesses
- Collecting payments
- Hanging posters around the neighborhood
- Delivering "Ice Cream Served Here" posters to all the participating businesses
- Going door-to-door with Ice Cream Maps to every address in Boise

Last year we had 49 flavors! We do not want any duplicate flavors- so the available flavors change everyday. If needed, I will be in contact to arrange an alternate flavor.

If you are unable to serve ice cream, you can also participate by giving a **donation** (which allows non-profits to participate and pays for printing); everyone who makes a financial contribution will be listed on the Ice Cream Maps. We also welcome **volunteers** to help distribute posters/maps or to be a volunteer scooper for a small business.



Schedule of Events:

ANYTIME: Place your “Ice Cream Served Here” sign in your window

2:30-4:00: Supply Delivery (bags, buckets, cones, maps, etc.)

4:00-5:30: Ice Cream Delivery (ice cream)

The volunteers will be running your ice cream in!

5:30-5:45: Set up your station (outside, in front of your location)

6:00-7:00: Start serving ice cream! Serve until 7:00 or it runs out ☺

Please wear gloves while you are serving ice cream.

AFTER: Please help by cleaning up your station and the surrounding block.

COMPOST: Every person that ordered bowls & spoons will also get a compostable bag AND a sign that says “your bowls & spoons are compostable, please place→”.

Following the event, please take your full bag to _____. We will double check that the compost is sorted correctly and Cloudburst has agreed to pick it up!

NEXT YEAR: Save your scoop and bucket for next year. Send any suggestions or ideas for the 6th Annual Ice Cream Social to _____.

KEEPING IT ALL COLD: It is different for 3 gallon buckets/novelty items—

3 gallon buckets of ice cream: Keep it OUT of a cooler/freezer for 45 min – 1 1/2 hour in order for it to be ready/soft-enough to be served.

Novelty ice cream: Keep it IN a cooler/freezer at all times.

Sunshine’s advice: Get it out of the sun. Adding ice cubes actually warms up the ice cream. They suggested putting ice cubes in the bottom of a cooler, setting a shelf/bucket/cookie sheet in the cooler, and setting the novelty ice cream items on top of that.
